

Autumn Watercolor Series: Autumn Explorations

Tuesdays Oct. 7, 14, 21 and 28, 2:30 to 5:30 p.m. Teens and adults

The first session will focus on the materials and the basics of color preparation, brushwork and letting the water do the work. The Beauty of Gray: Charcoal Still Life with Shells and Skulls
