

What to do if you find injured or orphaned wildlife.



The wellbeing of wildlife is of paramount importance to the NJSEA in keeping with its goal of protecting natural resources in the Meadowlands. If you find wildlife that you believe is injured or orphaned, you may contact a wildlife rehabilitator permitted by the State of New Jersey. The NJSEA is not authorized or otherwise permitted to care for such animals and therefore cannot accept them.
